# Sandra Maudier Memorial Scholarship

### About the Scholarship

The Sandra Maudier Memorial Scholarship commemorates the contributions of the late Sandra Maudier to Chisholm Institute and the broader community services sector, particularly around raising awareness of family violence, gender equality and cultural diversity challenges.

In line with this legacy, the scholarship supports a student who has experienced an intersection of challenges, such as financial hardship, disability, non-English speaking background (NESB), lived experience of family violence, disadvantaged background or other challenges.

The scholarship covers half the tuition fees for a new student enrolled in the Graduate Certificate in Family Violence (Prevention and Practice), is offered once per intake of the course, and is valid for one year only. Note that the scholarship is competitive and the outcome is in no way a reflection on individual circumstances. The Sandra Maudier Memorial Scholarship is sponsored by the [Chisholm Higher Education College](#) and the [Chisholm Family Violence Training Hub](#).

### Scholarship eligibility

To be eligible to apply for this scholarship, you must meet the following criteria:

- > You have been offered a place in the next intake of the Graduate Certificate in Family Violence (Prevention and Practice)
- > You have been provided a Statement of Fees (completed all enrolment requirements)
- > Your study plan is to complete the four required subjects within one year (two consecutive semesters)
- > You have experienced an intersection of challenges leading up to applying for your course
- > Your application is received no less than 15 working days prior to course commencement

### Application process

- > Complete this application form, optionally include supporting documentation verifying your personal statement

- > The review panel will meet to assess all applications, and you will be notified by email of the outcome prior to commencing your course

## Terms and conditions

To be eligible for a scholarship you must meet the criteria as outlined in the application form and have signed the application form. The scholarship is limited to one applicant per course intake through a competitive, merit based assessment and the outcome is not reflective of applicants' individual circumstances.

Scholarship value will be applied directly to your enrolment. Applicants will not receive any monetary payment to the value of the scholarship. Scholarship award is non-transferable. Scholarship will be applied as a 50% reduction per subject to tuition fees to the maximum of four subjects over one year (two consecutive semesters) from course commencement.

## Selection process

Applicants are required to complete the Scholarship application form and attach their additional supporting documents. The decision of the review panel is final and no further communication will be entered into.

## Survey participation

To assist us to maintain existing funding and secure new ongoing funding to provide future students of Chisholm with financial support to complete their studies, we are asking you as a condition of funding to participate in an ongoing study of the benefits to you of completing your qualification of choice. You may be asked to complete a short questionnaire twice a year and up to three years after you have commenced your qualification.

## General privacy statement

The Caroline Chisholm Education Foundation appreciates the importance of protecting personal and any health-related information. The Caroline Chisholm Education Foundation respects an individual's right to privacy and complies with the Commonwealth Privacy Act 1988, Victorian Information Privacy Act 2000 and the Victorian Health Records Act 2001.

The Caroline Chisholm Education Foundation will only collect information from you that is necessary in order to provide our services to you. This could include: name, address, date of birth, telephone numbers, emergency contacts and photograph for identification purposes.

The information you provide will only be used/disclosed for the reason you provided it, or for a secondary purpose that you would reasonably expect. The law also allows some uses/disclosures without consent, such as to protect safety.
