





Designing for body positivity

Dandenong Council's Youth and Family Services worked with Year 8 students from Killester College and the Butterfly Foundation to look at how social media affects body image. They collaborated to create the Body Image Project, which aims to promote a safer and more positive online experience.

Chisholm's Year 12 design students were asked to help by creating a social media toolkit for the project. They made visuals focused on body image and self-identity, gaining valuable experience in a meaningful design task.

Five standout designs were chosen for the campaign and are now featured on the Council's and Chisholm's social media pages.

VCE

Doing your VCE Year 11 and 12 at Chisholm gives you the flexibility to finish secondary school your way. You can also complete a VET course as part of your VCE program.

With fewer people per class than in mainstream schools, your dedicated teachers are there to support you every step of the way.

Chisholm offers VCE across three campuses: Dandenong, which is exclusively for adult VCE (18 and over), and Frankston and Berwick which are focused on our youth cohort (under 18). On completion, you'll earn your VCE and an ATAR score for entry into your preferred tertiary course.

VCE Vocational Major (VCE VM)

Finish your Year 11 and 12 studies while gaining real-world skills for your future career.

As part of the VCE, the VCE VM focuses on core units in numeracy, literacy, personal development, and work-related skills. You'll also select vocational units in areas like construction trades, healthcare, sport and fitness, early childhood education, or business and IT.

You'll get personalised support and hands-on work experience. Plus, you'll learn in an adult learning environment so you can take charge of your journey and start building your career pathway.







Money matters

Your study costs will depend on the specific course you enrol in and its requirements.

At Chisholm, course fees cover your tuition. There may be additional fees for services, facilities, equipment, and essential materials, so the full cost will depend on the type of course and its specific requirements.

What fees will you pay?

Government-subsidised fees

If you're an Australian or New Zealand citizen, hold a permanent visa, are an asylum seeker or are a victim of human trafficking, you may qualify for Victorian and Commonwealth government-subsidised training to help reduce course costs.

Concession fees

If you hold an eligible concession card or are listed as a dependant on one, you may be eligible for discounted tuition fees on Certificate IV courses and below. If you identify as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander, you may also be eligible for a tuition fee waiver across all vocational education levels. Concession fee discounts apply to government-subsidised training only.

Full fees

If you are an international student or don't meet Government subsidy eligibility criteria, you may need to pay full course fees. For course fee information, visit the relevant course page by visiting **chisholm.edu.au/courses**.

Other fees

Additional costs may apply depending on your course. These could include:

- > Materials fees for essential items such as learning resources, personal protective equipment, or uniforms.
- > Student services fees for access to student services and on-campus activities.

What about Free TAFE?

We offer more than 50 Free TAFE courses across high-growth industries, like childhood education, allied health, trades (excluding apprenticeships), and community and social services.

If you're eligible for government-subsidised training in Victoria, you may be eligible for Free TAFE. Free TAFE covers tuition fees for approved courses. Some costs, like student services or materials fees, may still apply.

You may also be able to complete multiple Free TAFE courses within the same Free TAFE pathway, helping you build your skills and expand your career options.
